



## Active Learning and Innovative Teaching in Flexible Learning Spaces

### Main evaluation findings

The information presented in this document is based on **course registration and participation (started/completed) data**\*, and on the data collected via **2** surveys completed voluntarily before (**pre**) and after (**post**) the course, providing information about:

- the **profile** of course participants (**Slides 3-7**).
- the participants' **course impressions** (**Slide 8-10**).
- participants' **self-assessed knowledge** of course topics (**Slide 11**).

On **Slide 2** we offer an overview of the key results.

Based on: **registration** and **participation** data, **pre: 564** responses and **post: 388** responses.

## Overview and key findings

### MOOC URL

#### Main audiences:

The course is targeted primarily to secondary school teachers and school leaders.

#### Course started:

17 Jan 2022

#### Course deadline:

23 Feb 2022

#### Modules: 4

- According to data collected via the pre-course survey, the majority of course participants are secondary school teachers, female and 36 years old or older.
- All **98%** rated the overall value of the course as “Good” or “Very good”.
- All **91%** would recommend this course to a colleague (**Agree** or **Agree strongly**).
- All **94%** Agreed that they will use the ideas and examples presented in the course.

*\* The participant is counted as a completer if the participant has explored all the sections of the MOOC and did all the activities.*

*\*\* The course engagement rate is calculated by dividing the number of participants who explored at least one section of the course by the total number of participants who registered to the course.*

*\*\*\* The course completion rate is calculated by dividing the total number of participants who explored at least one section of the MOOC by the total number of participants that completed the course (by exploring all the sections of the course).*

**3158** people from **72** countries registered to take part in the MOOC

**1914** participants started following at least one course module

**687** participants who completed the MOOC\*

**61%** engagement rate\*\*

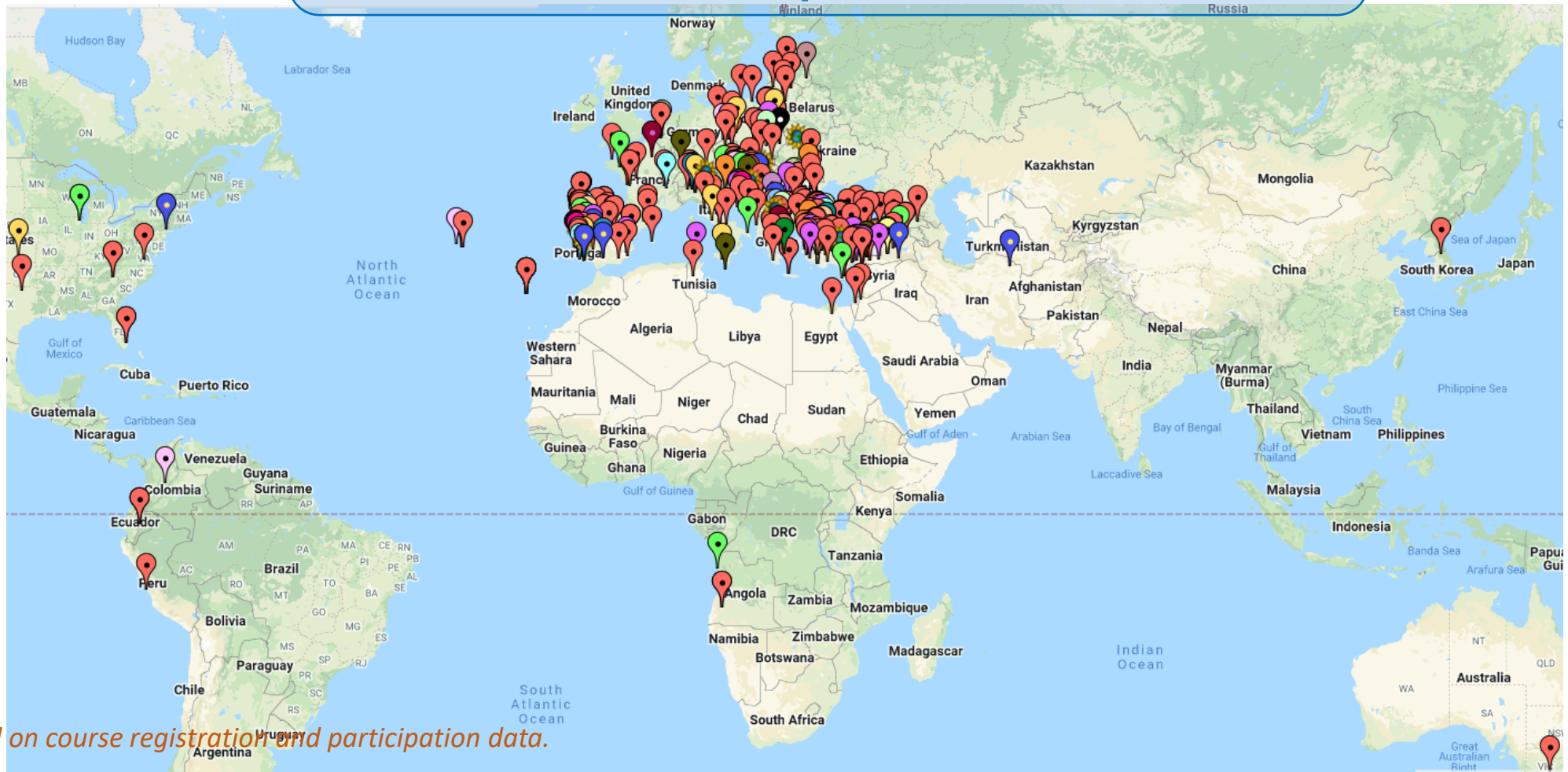

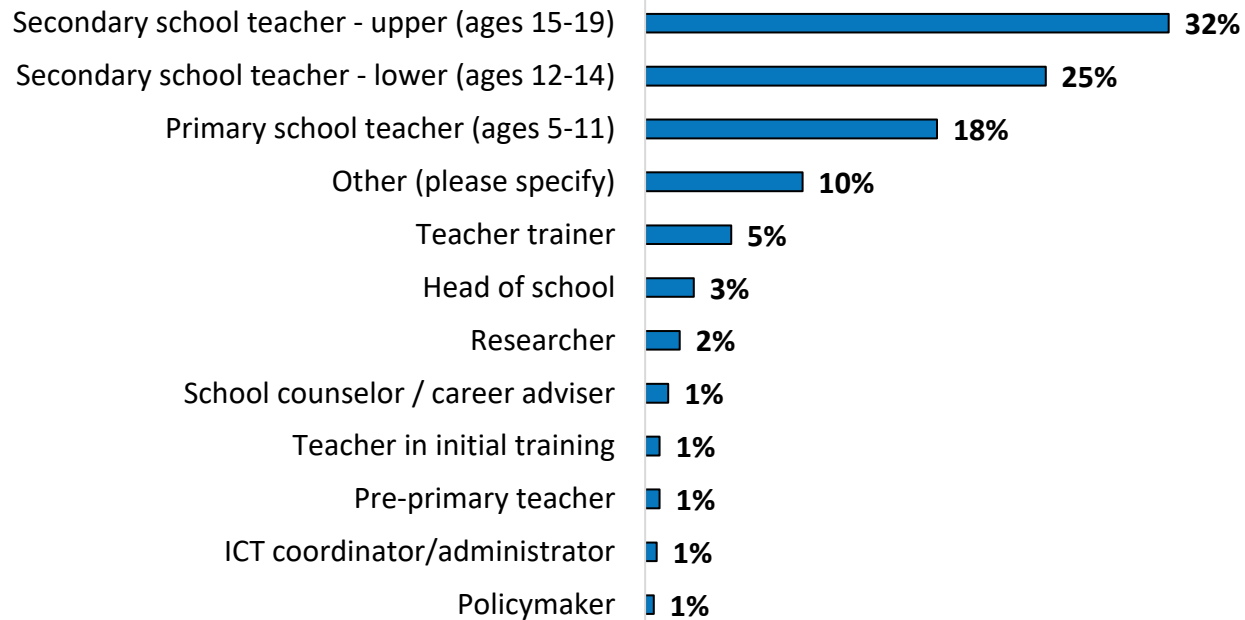

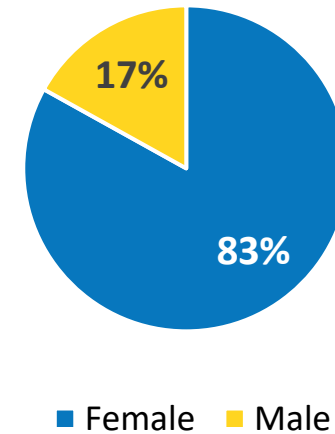

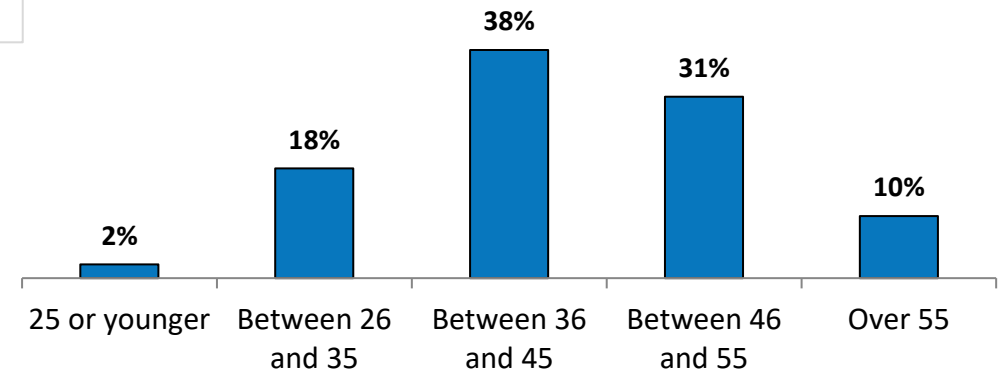
### What is your current position?



### What is your gender?



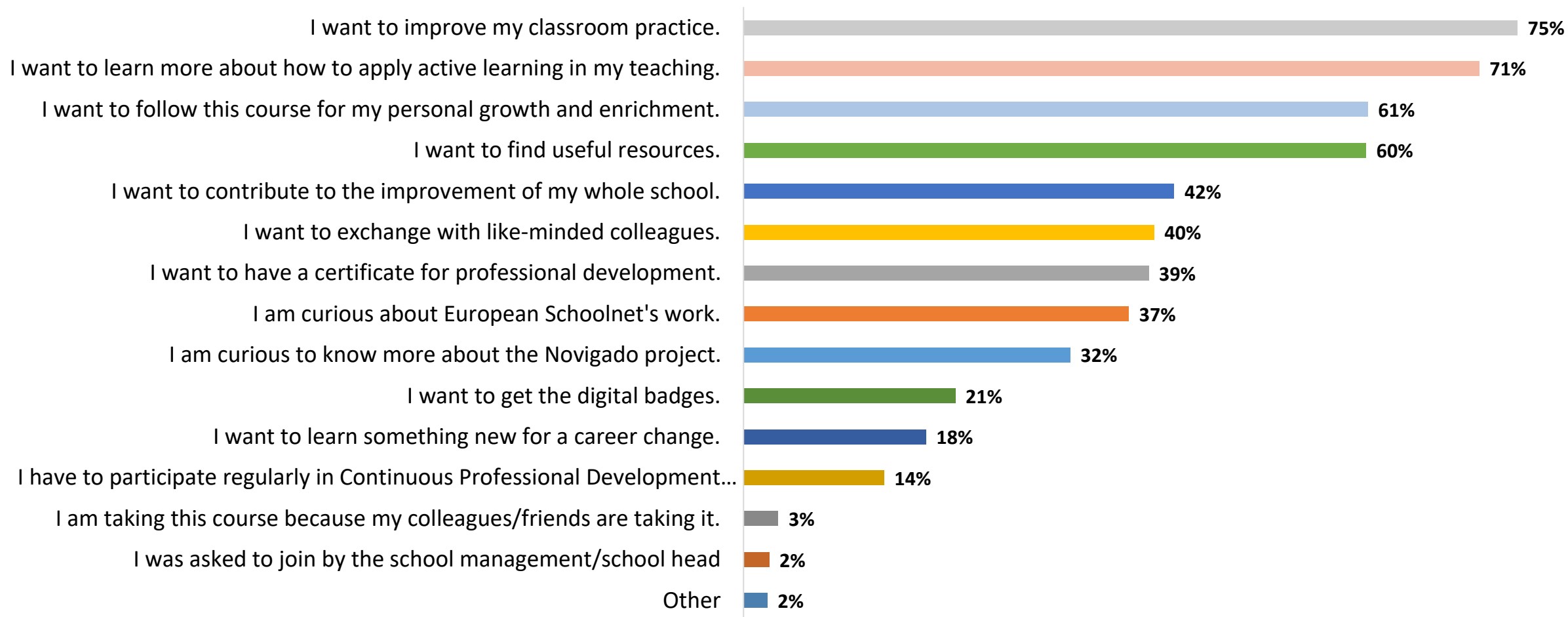
### How old are you?

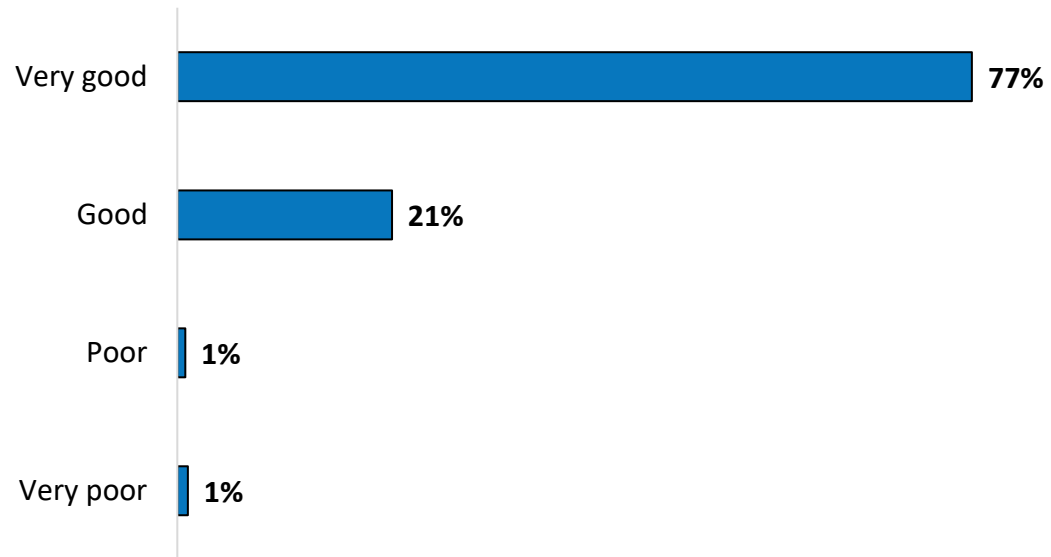
- Upper secondary school teachers

### What are your main motivations for joining this EUN Academy course? (more than one answer possible)

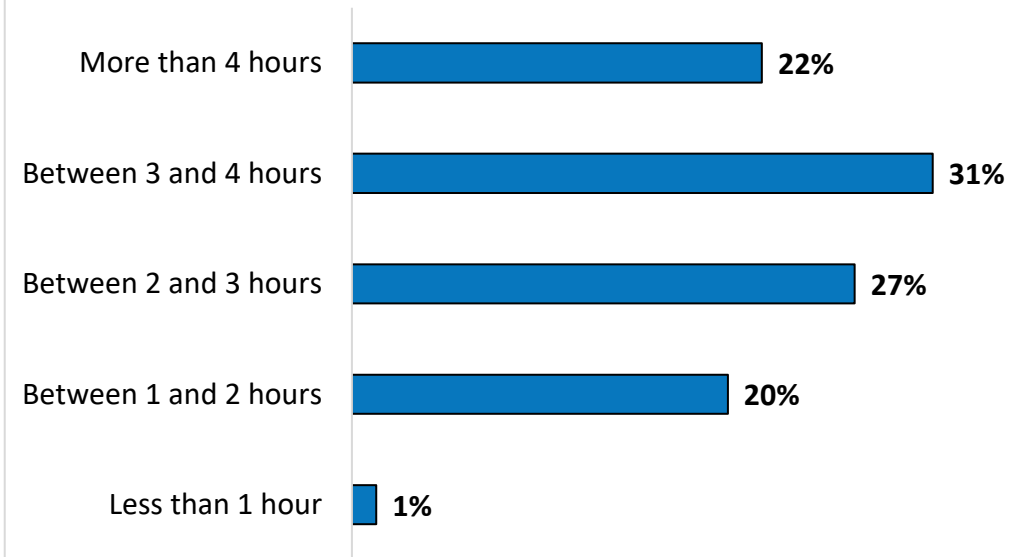


## Course impressions

**94%** Agree or Agree strongly that they will use the ideas and examples presented in the course.

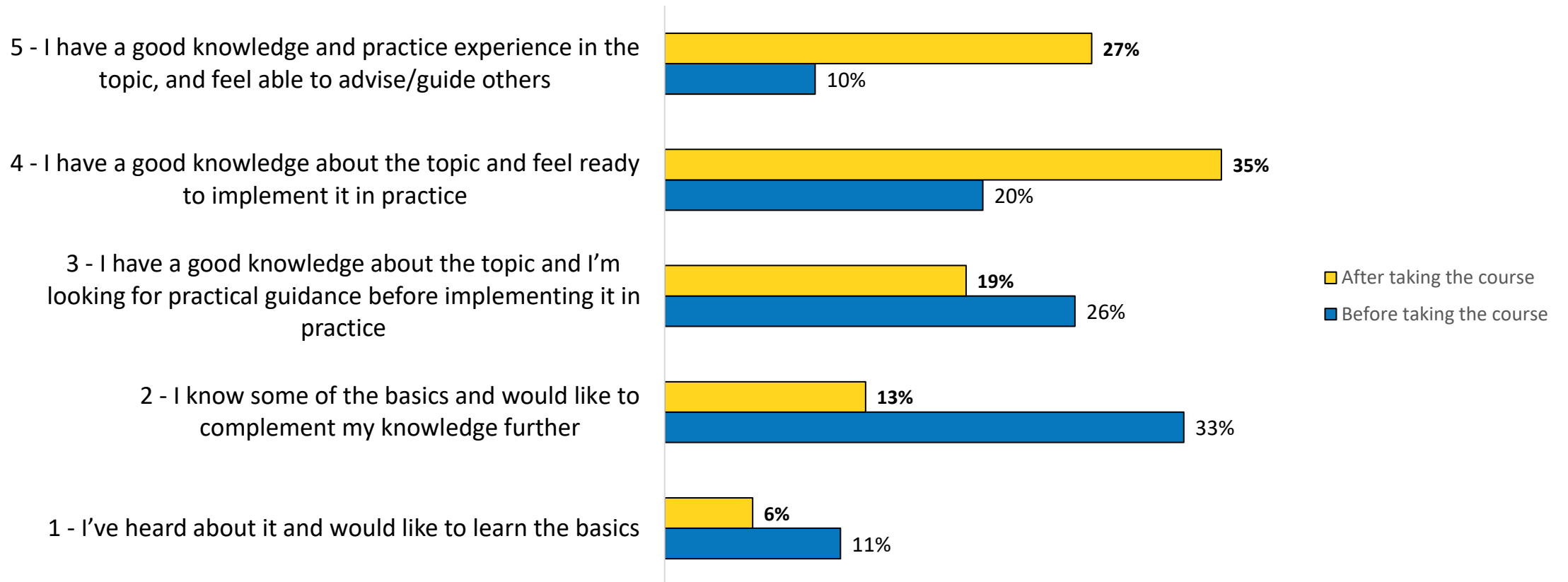
**To what extent do you agree with the following statements since you completed the course?**

After taking the course, participants' self-evaluated competence related to the course topic has improved.

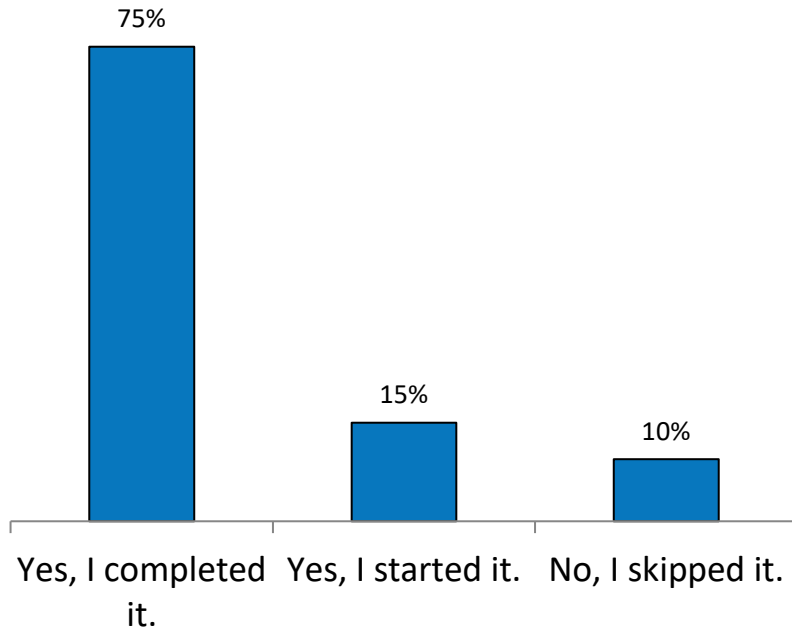
**Which statement below best represents your level of competence in using resources and strategies for applying active learning (student centered pedagogies) in the classroom**

Participating in the practice peer assessment helped me with my lesson plan for the final activity in Module 4

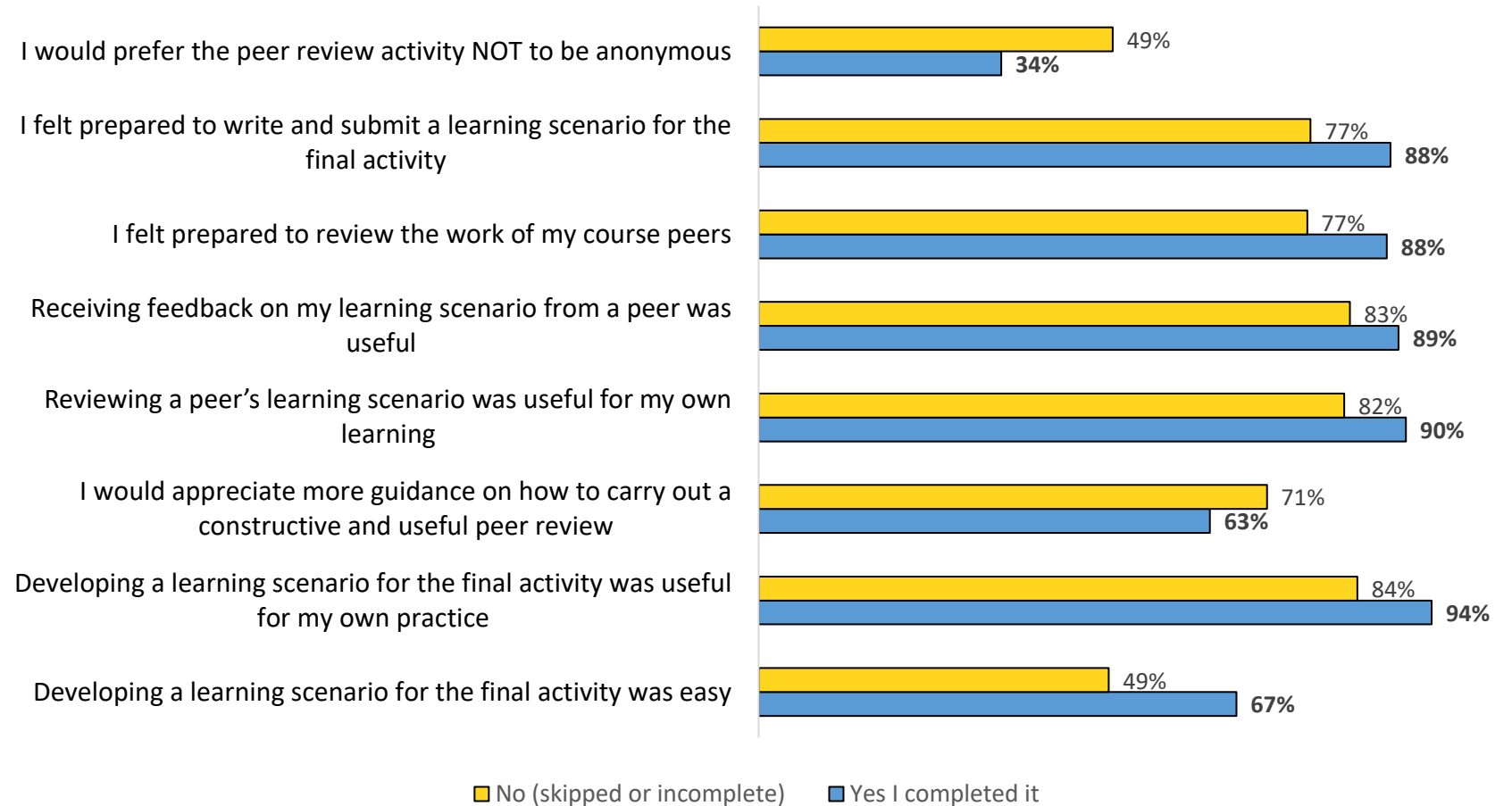
